As we enter week two of distance learning, we want to help normalize a situation that is very much abnormal. Your children are used to spending six and a half hours a day at school. During their time at school, they are learning, playing, socializing, and participating in the structure and routines that they need to thrive. On March 13, 2020, students went from a typical Friday at school to school, closing for an undetermined amount of time, resulting in being at home full time and learning digitally or through a paper packet. Undoubtedly this has been a shock to their system and yours. To create a sense of normalcy and comfort during this time, each teacher has provided a suggested daily schedule for your child(ren) to follow as they learn from home. Our students must continue to engage in learning to prevent learning loss. The schedules closely align with the schedules they would be following if they were at school. By following a schedule, you are providing structure and normalcy in a time where your child is most likely a little confused and lost. All teachers are available during regular school hours to offer support to you and your children. They are checking their email regularly throughout the school day. Teachers are also working on schedules for individual tutoring sessions via Zoom or phone for each of their students. Those schedules will be available next week.
